Additional requirements to take the BCBA® Board Examination include a graduate degree and supervised fieldwork. Fieldwork is not required as part of the MS program and must be obtained independently of the program. The program will provide advice to students seeking options for such supervision. Supervised fieldwork, according to the Behavior Analyst Certification Board, Inc.® may not begin until the first course in the approved sequence (ABA 513) has been started.
